Community facility management focus roadshow: Eskdalemuir Community Hub

The session opened with a welcome from Selina McMorran, Third Sector Dumfries and Galloway's Community Engagement Officer (Annandale and Eskdale).

The theme of the Roadshow was decided through pre-engagement with organisations in Eskdale and surrounding areas. Through this engagement it was highlighted that a Community Facility Management focus Roadshow in Eskdalemuir would be beneficial.

The format of the day included a presentation from Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS). There was an opportunity for 1:1 meeting with Nick Paterson, Facilities Management Advisor and the TSDG Engagement Team, who were able to offer advice around governance, funding, volunteering and social enterprise. - Funding required to support community owned facilities to continue to develop their facilities
- Training could be beneficial for community groups considering taking over an asset and what there legal requirements are
- For continued development sustainability of the organisation needs to be considered at every stage.

Current support landscape

What does the current support landscape look like for Community Owned Facilities?

The main organisation offering devoted support for organisations considering taking on an asset or already in ownership of an asset is Community Ownership Support Services (COSS).

This adviser-based service is being delivered Scotland wide and aims to provide individual community groups and public bodies with a bespoke support service from the first steps to the completion of the asset transfer. Their support includes a combination of -

- Expert advice on all aspects of asset transfer
- Training courses on the asset transfer and asset development process
- A wealth of written materials and training modules
- Web access to information on good practice, toolkits and case studies.
- Sign-posting to other support agencies

Community Land Commission work with a wide range of stakeholders across a number of sectors, both public, private and social enterprise to deliver their programme of work, to support organisations to look at land ownership.



Community Land Scotland help communities and landowners to secure land for growing and nature-based activities, enabling people across Scotland to benefit. Their information and advice service makes good use of Scotland's policy opportunities, and supports you with the experience and knowledge of their members and partners.
